#### You Asked .... We Listened

In the Fall of 2007, the users of the Caledon Parent-Child Centre/Ontario Early Years Centre (CPCC/OEYC) were asked to complete the FRP (Family Resource Programs) Canada e-Valuation. The e-Valuation was developed by FRP Canada in response to requests from its members for practical, meaningful and appropriate evaluation tools. 240 participants completed the survey in order to provide feedback on the programs and services provided by the CPCC/OEYC. Results were tabulated by Data Analysis Coordinators at the Region of Peel and forwarded to FRP Canada. A summary of the results can be accessed on our website at www.cp-cc.org and a printed copy is available at our Centre.

Overall, the survey reflected that parents/caregivers are satisfied with the service received at the CPCC/OEYC. Comments and suggestions from the evaluation will be used for ongoing program improvement. We would like to thank those survey respondents who took the time to complete the e-Valuation. Your feedback is valuable to us. If at any time you have any other suggestions, please feel free to communicate these to staff or complete a comment card available in the snack area of the main playroom.

#### **New Programs & Workshops**

We are excited to announce some new programs and workshops for parents and families this Fall offering information and support to families with young children. Registration is required.

Super Circle (every Monday and Saturday morning beginning the week of Sept 22): This theme-based story time will include songs, stories and a craft activity for families to enjoy.

Creative Kids (Sept 24 - Nov 12): Back by popular demand. Children and adults will explore all aspects of the arts including drama, music and visual arts

Infant Massage (Sept 26 - Oct 24): This five-part series will teach parents the importance of human touch, the benefits of massage and how to use massage techniques to calm and connect with your baby.


