Chair & Executive Director Message

A Year Like No Other

The first wave of the COVID-19 pandemic forced temporary closures; however, our commitment to children and families remained steadfast and strong. We rapidly responded by transitioning to virtual services and other supports to reach families in new ways. This included live, interactive sessions and recorded programs, offering flexible and accessible options to learn and connect. Curbside pickups of activity kits and resources were safely shared with families to enrich learning and development at home.

In September, we eagerly opened our doors and welcomed back families. Albeit brief, in-Centre and outdoor programs were offered under enhanced health and safety protocols. At the forefront, were our exceptional staff working hard to ensure quality experiences for families while delivering programs safely. Families embraced the opportunity to explore outdoor play and physically distanced connections. Our educators provided captivating activities that encouraged children to find materials and discover ways to interact with nature, sparking curiosity and promoting physical literacy and emotional well-being.



While all families find a home at CPCC, those with complex needs and barriers continued to benefit from uniquely tailored supports. Families struggling with basic needs were provided with essential goods, meals, grocery and gas cards. Educators and family support facilitators provided ongoing telephone support. Staff answered questions and referred families to community supports and resources. Ideas, strategies, and referrals were provided to support parenting needs and concerns.

In an unprecedented year, staff were able to adapt and innovate services and community engagement strategies. Technology infrastructure was upgraded to support virtual programs and physical environments were adapted to ensure safe play. Families were engaged in socially distanced community events throughout Caledon's rural and urban villages. Through the ups and downs of the various waves, our virtual and in-person programs and events kept families connected and helped minimize feelings of isolation during the pandemic.

In 2020, the team was busy fixturing and furnishing 2 new EarlyON Centres, located in Southfields Community Centre and Caledon East Community Complex. These Centres will add approximately 25 hours of service per week in Caledon. We look forward to welcoming families and children in these beautiful spaces when we are safely able to re-open.

This year we put our Year 2 strategic initiatives into action. Our deep connection and commitment to families, and Caledon's changing landscape remain at the centre of our strategic plan. We began by affirming our commitment to the principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion by unveiling our Equity Commitment Statement. Our Equity Task Force was hard at work and focused efforts in 3 key areas: our workplace, our services, and the Caledon community. An external consultant guided Board and staff in training and shared recommendations for continuous learning and growth. These demonstrated actions are examples of how we are working to achieve our vision, deliver on our mission, and live our values.

As we navigate challenging times, we would like to acknowledge and thank our funders and donors. Through your financial flexibility and investment, we have been able to adapt services to best respond to the needs of families parenting through the pandemic.

To our staff, thank you for your resilience, adaptability and enduring commitment to Caledon children and families. We also want to recognize our dedicated Board of Directors for exceptional governance in difficult times. To our volunteers, community partners, champions, and families; thank you for your collaboration and support. And finally, as we all continue to weather lockdowns and restrictions, we are here with you - whether onsite or online - and our motto remains, "Keep calm and carry on".
